Post-Secondary Financial Assistance

For those with limited financial resources, there are several grants to help. Disability centres at Universities and Colleges generally require a recent educational assessment (some will help your child get assessed.)

Procedure

- 1. <u>Apply for Canada Student Loan assistance first.</u> Even if you are not planning on taking a government loan (OSAP in Ontario), your son or daughter's eligibility for assistance opens the door to the disability-related grants below. (Grants are non-repayable and taxable.)
- 2. <u>Bring the separate application form for the grants (available from website below) to the University/College disability centre office</u> when you arrange a meeting with them (after your son/daughter has been accepted to the institution and you have received notice of loan acceptance). The office needs to sign off on the applications.

Grants

1. Canada Study Grant for the Accommodation of Students with Permanent Disabilities

<u>Grant</u>: up to \$8000 per loan year to cover costs associated with your disability such as tutors, note takers, technical aids, etc. or 75% of the cost of a learning disability assessment up to \$1200. <u>Eligibility</u>: appropriate medical documentation, i.e., educational assessment preferably that also outlines the types of equipment and support that will allow your son/daughter to participate in post-secondary studies.

<u>To apply</u>: you must qualify for full-time or part-time Canada Student Loan assistance and then complete a separate application form (form accessed through website below).

2. Canada Access Grant for Students with Permanent Disabilities

<u>Grant</u>: up to \$2000 per loan year for those with financial need for tuition, books, supplies, and living costs, etc.

<u>Eligibility</u>: appropriate medical documentation, i.e., educational assessment or receipt of government disability assistance

<u>To apply</u>: eligibility will be determined during the assessment of your student loan application.

3. Bursary for Students with Disabilities (provincial)

Bursary: up to \$2000 per loan year for those in financial need

<u>Eligibility</u>: same as Canada Study Grant for the Accommodation of Students with Permanent Disabilities requirements

<u>To apply</u>: you must qualify for full-time or part-time Canada Student Loan assistance and then complete a separate application form (form accessed through website below).
