

Communication Considerations

Communication is important in toileting:

- to indicate when you need to use the washroom
- to ask where a washroom or items needed for the washroom are
- to indicate when something is uncomfortable or wrong





Communication Considerations

- Vocal communication
- Augmentative and alternative communication system
 - A sign for toilet
 - A picture-based system
 - Speech generating device

Social Considerations

- Unspoken social rules related to the use of the washroom
- Helpful to teach these to help our children know what to expect and how to respond safely





Social Considerations

Examples:

- Spacing self appropriately when using a urinal
- Lining up to use washrooms
- Knocking before entering
- Refilling the toilet paper when use the last piece
- Appropriate disposal of sanitary napkins

Environmental Considerations


- Show how things work
- Help make your child comfortable:
 - Proper positioning
 - Place items in reach
 - Be mindful of sensory needs (AOTA, 2014)





Environmental Considerations


- Help make bathroom visits positive
 - Book? song?
- Make a plan for when using other bathrooms
 - Automatic flushing, hand dryers
 - Line-ups?
